FROM THE RECTOR

Living in the Light of Christ

During the Middle Ages, a story circulated about Martin of Tours, a Christian after whom Martin Luther was named. It was said that Satan appeared to Martin in the guise of Jesus. Martin was ready to fall to his feet and worship this vision. But then he noticed that the vision's hands and feet didn't bear the marks of crucifixion. "Where are the nail marks?" Martin asked. At that, the apparition vanished.

The suffering crucified Christ is always at the centre of true Christian living. But people sometimes get the idea that if they would just give their lives to Christ, they will no longer experienced problems and difficulties. But suffering is a part of life, and the Bible gives us numerous examples of godly people who endured tremendous pain and suffering.

But this raises the question: how can we embrace joy in a world filled with pain and suffering? and is it right to be joyful in a world of hunger and violence and injustice?

But it is precisely here that we make one of the most surprising discoveries: often it is the people closest to suffering who have the greatest joy. People who were friends of Mother Teresa never remember her being overwhelmed by the suffering around her. They said she always glowed with joy as she went about her ministry of mercy.

One of the English officers imprisoned at Flossenburg with the famous German theologian Dietrich Bonhoeffer, during the Second World War, said that Bonhoeffer always seemed to "spread an atmosphere of happiness and joy over the least incidence and profound gratitude for the mere fact that he was alive."

True joy, as it turns out, comes only to those who have devoted their lives to something greater than personal happiness. This is most visible in extraordinary lives, like saints and martyrs. But this doesn't stop ordinary people like us from experiencing this very same joy.

One test of authentic joy is its compatibility with pain. Joy in this world is always joy "in spite of" something. And this Joy can only be maintained by Jesus being at the heart of everything we say, do and think.

Luke's gospel records the appearance of the Risen Christ to two of his disciples on the road to Emmaus (Luke 24:13-34). At first it sounds like a story of sheer despair. He whom they had set their hopes on as the Redeemer and the deliverer of Israel had been hounded to a cross, and it seemed that all their hopes were dust and ashes. But the point of the story is that they were still talking about Jesus. Bewildered they might be, but they could not forget. Their world was shattered, but somewhere at the heart of it all there was Jesus. There are times when people cannot understand; there are times when life is a dark mystery when there are problems which are so immense that they defy all solution. But if at the heart of our personal world we can still see Jesus, if he is still quite unforgettable, if he is placed at the centre of our hearts and minds, then in the end he will come to us — and the darkness we see will be replaced with the joy of his glorious light.

My family and I wish you, and those you love, a very Happy and Holy Easter.

Unfortunately due to the wet weather we postponed our "Spotlight" section of the night but thought we could do this activity to coincide with our Easter Celebrations on 5th April. Our short film making was rather interesting. Fr Gary and Karen kindly brought in their puppet collection for the children to work with. Fr Gary explained to the children the best way to use the puppets to "bring them to life" when working with them. The children all selected a puppet to work with that night and they put together some very interesting skits. Karen was our photographer and film maker for the night and the children got to take home a copy of the skits as Karen copied them on to their USB sticks they brought in.







